The Traouïero, which has always been a natural haunt for various characters, both real and fictional, remains a magical world.






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The Traouïero valley





1 The tombstone

It is the gateway to Perros-Guirec over the Kerougant at Tropéric.
The use of a gravestone may seem surprising, but for many years, concessions were not perpetual, giving families the opportunity to recover or sell gravestones. This one dates from 1833.

2 The Leper's Grotto

It was once occupied by a certain Yan ar Pronz. There are still a few traces of the life of the man who was probably mistaken for a leper to explain his hermitage, such as a trough dug into the granite where food was deposited for the recluse.

3 The Smugglers' Cave

This cave has been used for a variety of purposes over the centuries, such as during the Occupation, when it was used to hide horses requisitioned during the war, but more poetically, it was also sometimes used by our ancestors as a meeting place for lovers.

4 The pond

Also known as the 'mouse-tail' pond because of its shape when viewed from above.

5 The Korrigan's Grotto

Immerse yourself in an enchanted atmosphere where childhood and fantasy meet, as you approach the village of the Korrigan.
Around ten years ago, a young girl brought this place to life by creating a little village of earthen pots. Since then, walkers have enriched it with a thousand and one decorations.
